- Successful completion of a Master's degree, with preference in Educational Psychology, Social Work, or Occupational Therapy.

- Minimum of three years' experience in educational settings including experience working with adults with disabilities.
- Experience in navigating emergent/urgent situations and referrals dealing with complex disability related needs, but not limited to, ADHD, mental health, ASD
- Well-developed problem solving and decision making skills required when determining accommodation and support for students with disabilities by assessing disability-related documentation and student situation.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills, including conflict resolution skills to deal effectively with students, faculty, the Toronto Metropolitan University Community and external professionals.
- Knowledge of a wide range of disabilities, including ADHD, ASD, Learning Disabilities, medical, psychiatric, sensory and physical / functional, as well as best practices in providing academic accommodations.
