### Description

The Department of Pediatrics, Division of Neonatology is seeking one (1) full-time faculty member to join a committed team in a stimulating environment that combines a regionalized perinatal service and internationally recognized strength in research and medical education across the complete spectrum of child health. The successful candidate will be considered a clinician&ndash;educator but will also provide support to the Divisional and Departmental research activities. Faculty members are expected to share in the clinical responsibilities of the NICU service while promoting the profile of McMaster University and McMaster Children&rsquo;s Hospital through educational and research endeavours. The Neonatal Division is an important service within McMaster Children&rsquo;s Hospital (MCH), with the pediatric regional referral centre serving a population of more than 2.3 million in south central Ontario. The Neonatal wards include a 49-bed NICU as one of the largest level III units in the country as well as a 14-bed level II unit, with a multidisciplinary team providing comprehensive patient care. There are more than 1300 newborn admissions per year including more than 200 VLBW infants. The full spectrum of admissions includes all types of congenital malformations and non-cardiac post-surgical care. This position will incorporate an academic appointment, and academic rank and salary will be commensurate with the experience and expertise of the applicant. Applicants should be certified (or eligible for certification) by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Neonatology and must be licensed (or eligible for licensure) in the Province of Ontario. Expressions of interest should include: A curriculum vitae and cover letter A brief statement describing any contributions made or planned in relation to advancing equity, diversity and inclusion or inclusive excellence in teaching, research, or service within higher education, community-based or other profession settings (2-page maximum) Names and contact information of three professional referees; letters of reference are not required and will not be reviewed at the application stage; letters of recommendation from referees will be requested at later stages of the search process.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be considered first for this position. To comply with the Government of Canada&rsquo;s reporting requirements, the University is obliged to gather information about applicants&rsquo; status as either Permanent Residents of Canada or Canadian citizens. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or current citizenship; however, all applications must include one of the following statements: Yes, I am a citizen or permanent resident of Canada &ndash; or &ndash; No, I am not a citizen or permanent resident of Canada.
