- Master's degree in business administration, public administration, public policy, Indigenous studies, history or a related field and at least three (3) years' related experience; or
- Bachelor's degree in a relevant area and at least five (5) years' related experience; or
- Technical diploma in engineering, applied sciences or a related field and at least seven (7) years' related experience; or an equivalent combination of the education and related experience may be considered.

Related Experience must include all of the following:

- Experience leading multi-disciplinary teams in a highly intense working environment.
- Experience providing strategic Indigenous relations advice to ministry executive, senior government officials (or private sector equivalent) on projects/negotiations status.
