At the request of the Attorney General and in accordance with the Justices of the Peace Act, the Justices of the Peace Appointments Advisory Committee (JPAAC) invites applications for vacant justice of the peace positions in the province of Ontario in the following court location:

A justice of the peace is an independent judicial officer who presides in court over various proceedings under federal and provincial statutes. This is a full-time appointment that requires travel within the province.

Qualifications:

Applicants must meet minimum qualifications as set out in the Justices of the Peace Act. Candidates must have at least 10 years of paid or volunteer experience, and:

- have a university degree;
- have a diploma or advanced diploma granted by a college of applied arts and technology or a community college following completion of a program that is the equivalent in class hours of a full-time program or of at least four academic semesters;
- have a degree from an institution, other than a university, that is authorized to grant the degree; or meet the educational equivalency requirement set out in s.2(1.3) of the Justices of the Peace Act.

Selection Criteria:

In addition to reflecting the diversity of the population in Ontario, applicants should also display the fundamental skills and abilities, personal characteristics and community awareness attributes set out in the JPAAC General Selection Criteria, including:

1. Proven ability and experience in making sound, practical, and timely decisions with complex factors.
2. Demonstrated a multi-year commitment to high level leadership or achievement in employment or community service, with these pursuits forming an integral part of their professional and community contributions.
3. Awareness and understanding of the breadth, depth, and commitment required for the role of a justice of the peace and the skills and abilities applicable to the vacancy.
4. Keen interest in people and humanity as demonstrated through compassion, empathy, and engagement with aspects of diversity relevant to the vacancies to which you apply.
5. Exhibits superior oral and written communication skills and an ability to present a clear, concise, and well-written application.
6. Work, volunteer, education, or other experience that is clearly relevant and transferable to the duties and responsibilities of a justice of the peace.
7. Ability and willingness to learn, substantiated through the candidate's record of life-long learning.
8. Exemplifies a strong work ethic, with a proven reputation for reliability and preparedness. Has the ability to work both co-operatively and independently.
9. Displays a high level of interpersonal skills, character, and integrity.
10. Bilingual ability, if applicable.

11. Possess the required level of experience required to perform the duties of a justice of the peace.

For vacancies that serve large Indigenous communities (one vacancy each in Barrie and Kitchener, and two each in Sioux Lookout and Toronto), candidates of Indigenous heritage with an in-depth understanding of the Indigenous communities that vacancy serves are encouraged to apply. If selected for an interview, candidates for Indigenous vacancies will be asked to submit documentation to support their Indigenous self-identification.

Justice of the peace positions designated as "bilingual" require a Superior level of proficiency in French, in addition to a high degree of proficiency in English. Candidates will be required to complete a customized language proficiency test on which they must achieve a Superior level of proficiency. French proficiency tests are valid for two years.

Un juge de paix est un fonctionnaire judiciaire independant qui preside un tribunal d'application des lois federales et provinciales. C'est un poste a temps plein qui necessite de se deplacer dans la province.

Qualifications

Les candidats doivent satisfaire aux conditions minimales enoncees dans la Loi sur les juges de paix. Ils doivent avoir au moins 10 ans d'experience de travail remunere ou benevole, et :

- etre titulaire d'un diplome universitaire;
- etre titulaire d'un diplome delivre par un etablissement d'enseignement superieur d'arts appliques et de technologie ou un etablissement d'enseignement superieur communautaire a l'issue d'un programme equivalent en heures de cours a un programme a temps plein ou d'au moins quatre sessions d'études;
- etre titulaire d'un diplome delivre par un etablissement, autre qu'une universite, qui est autorise a delivrer ce diplome ou satisfaire a l'exigence d'équivalence d'études enoncee au paragraphe 2 (1.3) de la Loi sur les juges de paix.

Criteres de selection :

Outre le fait de refleter la diversite de la population de l'Ontario, les candidats doivent egalement presenter les competences et aptitudes fondamentales, les caracteristiques personnelles et les attributs de connaissances des enjeux regionaux enonces dans les criteres de selection generaux du CCNJP :

1. Une capacite et une experience reconnues pour la prise de decisions reflechies, pratiques et rapides en presence de facteurs complexes.
2. Demontrer un engagement pluriannuel a l'egard du leadership de haut niveau ou des realisations en matiere d'emploi ou de service communautaire, ces activites faisant partie integrante de leurs contributions professionnelles et communautaires.
3. Connaissance et comprehension de l'ampleur, de la profondeur et de l'engagement requis pour le role d'un juge de paix, ainsi que des competences et des capacites applicables au poste vacant.

4. Vif interet pour les personnes et l'humanite, comme en temoignent la compassion, l'empathie et l'engagement a l'egard des aspects de la diversite pertinents aux postes vacants auxquels vous postulez.
5. Posseder des competences superieures en communication orale et ecrite et etre capable de presenter une demande claire, concise et bien redigee.
6. Des experiences de travail, de benevolat ou autres qui sont clairement pertinentes et transferables aux fonctions et responsabilites de juge de paix.
7. La capacite et la volonte d'apprendre, demontrees par le dossier d'apprentissage continu du candidat.
8. Incarner une solide ethique de travail, avec une reputation eprouvee en matiere de fiabilite et de preparation.
- Capacite de travailler en seul et en equipe.
9. Demontrer un haut niveau d'entregent, de caractere et d'integrite.
10. Bilinguisme (le cas echeant).

11. Posseder le niveau d'experience requis pour exercer les fonctions de juge de paix.

Pour des postes aupres de grandes collectivites autochtones (un poste a Barrie, un poste a Kitchener, deux postes a Sioux Lookout, et deux postes a Toronto), nous encourageons la candidature de personnes d'origine autochtone, qui comprennent bien les communautes autochtones que le titulaire du poste devra servir. S'ils sont selectionnes pour une entrevue, les candidats aux postes vacants pour les postes vacants designes «autochtones» devront presenter des documents appuyant leur auto-identification autochtone.

Les postes de juges de paix designes bilingues exigent une excellente maitrise du francais et une competence de niveau avance en anglais. Les candidats devront passer un test de competence linguistique personnalise, auquel ils devront obtenir un resultat de niveau superieur. Les tests de competence en francais sont valides deux ans.
