You will contribute to these goals by ensuring data integrity via API connections between on-premises and cloud-based applications, and providing support for our cloud-based applications and the integration of data, including documentation, business process, user case creation, testing, business analysis and task analysis.

To assume the role of Analyst III – Web Applications and Developer, you must be equally comfortable working on your own and in a team environment, and possess:

- Undergraduate degree in Computer Science or a related field, and three (3) to five (5) years' experience as an analyst, or an equivalent combination of education and experience.
- Strong understanding of fundraising applications in a higher education/not-for-profit environment.
- Experience training end users in the use of computer software applications.
- Experience related to customer service delivery in a technical field.
- Demonstrated familiarity with enterprise software packages that include Microsoft .NET, Visual Studio, and Blackbaud Development (SDK).
- Experience with HTML5, CSS, jQuery and various CMS platforms.
- Ability to analyze and critically evaluate information gathered from multiple sources, reconciling conflicts and deconstructing high-level information into details.
- Ability to work well independently and in a team environment.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills, both oral and written.
