â€¢ Master of Education in Counselling Psychology/Master of Arts in Counselling Psychology with completion of a practicum in family and child welfare as defined in the Job Profile attached at the

bottom of the posting; OR

â€¢ In-service Ministry of Children and Family Development employees who have a SPO 24-30 base position that requires delegation under the Child, Family and Community Services Act (CFCSA); OR

â€¢ Bachelorâ€™s Degree in a Human Services field or a Bachelorâ€™s Degree with a Major/Honors in a Human Services field PLUS a minimum of two years of recent, obtained in the last five years, *related work experience; OR

â€¢ Post Graduate Diploma/Certificate in a Human Services field (from a University or Graduate School) obtained AFTER completion of an unrelated degree PLUS a minimum of two years of recent, obtained in the last five years, *related work experience.

â€¢ Must possess and maintain a valid class 5 BC Driverâ€™s licence with no restriction or equivalent (i.e. from another Canadian Province).
