### Position Summary

Under the direction of the Senior Supervisor, Housing the Men's Transition House Evening Support Worker will:

- Provide a safe and secure setting by maintaining rules and expectations of the home.
- Provide supervision, support, and education to residents, particularly in the area of life skills and social development.
- Assist residents on an individual basis with their goal setting, and provide ongoing support to each resident in reaching their goals.
- Ensure residents are provided with the appropriate referrals for counselling, groups, classes etc.
- Ensure that equipment, inventory and supplies are maintained and protected.
- Maintain cleanliness of house and perimeter.
- Provide individual support such as crisis intervention, dispute resolution, and other supportive intervention.
- Develop and implement life, social, and cultural development groups.
- Provide written and verbal updates/assessments on the residents' readiness to participate in programs and activities.
- Address the cultural needs of the residents.
- Provide support to house case manager regarding information, referrals and follow-up services to residents.
- Maintain accurate and up-to-date case files according to specified time lines and provide written reports as requested.
- Represent Native Child and Family Services of Toronto at community level.
- Be available to work Monday to Friday from 4:00pm to 12:00am.

What we are looking for

- Post-Secondary education in the human services field (BSW, CYW, SSW)
- Minimum of one (2) year direct experience in the social work field (preferably in a transitional/group home environment).
- Pass a police record check (Vulnerable Sector)
- Current CPR and First-Aid certificate or willing to complete prior to commencement of employment.
- Knowledge of the resources available for Aboriginal peoples with respect to issues such as homelessness, addictions and mental health.

• Excellent written and verbal communication skills; organizational skills; initiative, and respect for confidentiality.

• A valid (G) Driver's License would be an asset.

• Demonstrated understanding, and commitment to, integrating the Native Child and Family Services of Toronto Mission and values in to practice, service and relationships.

• Demonstrated understanding of workplace Health and Safety practices and understanding of an employee's responsibility under current legislation.

• Ability to work effectively with all levels of staff, to maintain effective communication and working relationships, demonstrating strong interpersonal skills, tact, sensitivity and build strong internal relationships.
