In this course students will learn the basic tools and strategies necessary to become a researcher. Students will learn what methods are necessary to answer different questions and how to design their own research projects, including how to collect and analyze data. In this course students will also learn essential critical skills to assess the research of others. This course is a useful and practical course that helps students prepare for Level IV thesis or field work. Required Qualifications:A PhD or ABD is preferred, although applicants with MAs and teaching experience (either in post-secondary institutions or in the labour movement) will be considered. Applicants should have an interdisciplinary approach to labour issues.
