Under the direction of the Manager, Youth Services the NLC Youth Program Worker will:

• Connect on an ongoing basis with TDSB staff, instructors including UIEC staff as part of a team, to ensure holistic program delivery, cultural safety and positive outcomes for students.

• Support NLC administrators and teachers in the intake process for new student enrolment and advises on cultural supports.

• Work one-to-one with students to provide holistic wraparound case management to ensure students have the supports needed to be successful.

• Develop and lead teaching sessions on cultural learning for staff and students, and supports in program development to ensure cultural connection is embedded in all aspects of the program.

• Develop and maintains cultural program evaluation to ensure ongoing improvement and sustainability.

• Manage day-to-day activity, including mediation and restorative practice.

• Complete monthly food expenses, budgeting, tracking and reporting in collaboration with the Principal of the NLC.

• Maintain accurate and up-to-date records.

• Other duties as assigned by Manager of Youth Services and Principal of NLC.

• Participate in compliance training and professional activities days through TDSB.
