Victory Hill Dorm (VHD) provides a supportive and nurturing home-like environment for children and youth who must live away from home in order to attend the Provincial School for the Deaf. Children and youth live at VHD during the week and then return to their home communities to be with their families on the weekends. Children and youth range in age from 5 to 19 years old. The residence is staffed by qualified Child Care Counsellors who use American Sign Language as the working language.

Provincial Family Services (PFS) offers a supportive environment for learning and skill development. Services include language and literacy development, family and parent support, child and youth services and community awareness and development. The purpose of this position focuses on enhancing family capacity for communication and connection as well as engaging and empowering youth and young adults.

American and Indigenous Services (AIS) offers American Sign Language (ASL) instruction and support to children, youth and their families to strengthen their communication in ASL. AIS also offers services to Deaf and Hard of Hearing Indigenous children and youth and their families to connect with each other, Indigenous community members, and learn about their individual cultures and identities in an ASL environment.
