arts. The NAC presents, creates, produces, and co-produces performing arts programming in various streams-the NAC Orchestra, Dance, English Theatre, French Theatre, Indigenous Theatre, and Popular Music and Variety-and nurtures the next generation of audiences and artists from across Canada.

Key activities:

Reporting to the Director of Production and working under the direction of the Production Department Technical Directors. The Assistant Technical Director is primarily responsible for assisting the Indigenous Technical Director in the planning and co-ordination required to support the realization of productions, festivals and events held on the stages and in the lobbies of the NAC and its partners across the country. Specific duties include, but are not limited to: researching materials relevant to scenic or property construction, lighting, sound and projection, as well as drafting basic technical drawings, and the supervision of unionized stage crews.

This position should be of interest to those seeking to gain additional experience in technical production while be exposed to multiple disciplines within the performing arts.

Who can apply:

Persons residing in Canada and Canadian citizens abroad. Preference will be given to persons of Indigenous ancestry (s. 16(1) CHRA).

All communication will be conducted through email and interviews via videoconferencing. Please ensure to have the most up-to-date information on your resume including your current email address.

If you are a person with a disability and require accommodation for an interview or written exam, please advise us when initially contacted.

The successful candidate will be required to provide the original or a certified true copy of their education credentials as appropriate, along with proof of a valid Background Check as a condition of employment.

Education Requirements

Post-secondary diploma/degree specializing in the production of performing arts and/or three (3) years' experience in a technical role in the performing arts;

Essential Skills

Required qualifications:

- Experience with Indigenous performing arts, including but not limited to theatre, dance, music and/or pow wow; is an asset
- Proficiency in at least one area of production; lighting, audio, video or carpentry;
- Willingness to undertake challenging work that does not conform to regular schedules;
- Willingness to learn new skill sets and working methodology;
- Available to work evenings and weekends;
- An ability to work unsupervised while maintaining goals and an attention to detail;
- Proof of a valid driver's licence (equivalent to an Ontario G class permit) and clean driver abstract;
- The ability to drive a large cargo van and a 5-ton transport truck (automatic transmission) is an

asset;

- Proficiency in Microsoft Office;
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills;
- Strong verbal and writing skills in English; fluency in verbal French and/or an Indigenous language would be considered an asset but not required for consideration for the position.
- Experience in leading and motivating crews is an asset;
- Strong organization skills.
