Water is fundamental to BC's communities, ecosystems, food supply and economy. The provincial water program is a diverse group of environmental professionals who help support and make informed decisions with evidence-based policy and sound science. Program staff collaborates with internal and external partners to help ensure provincial water management is effective and sustainable. The program administers authorization for works in and about a stream under the Water Sustainability Act. It also oversees aspects of flood safety, dike inspection, dam safety and provision of technical hydrologic advice to internal and external government stakeholders. Program staff also oversee the operation of the Nicola dam.

As the Section Head, you will provide leadership and licensed professional oversight for water authorization programs in the Thompson Okanagan Region, including supervision of staff, managing stakeholder relationships, applying legislation, policies and standards, contributing to provincial water allocation and stewardship policy, overseeing a wide variety of technical and professional projects and activities, management of special projects to adapt to local service needs, stakeholder relationships and making statutory decisions as an authority under provincial legislation.

You will play a critical role in overseeing all Thompson Okanagan Region's Water Sustainability Act approvals, the management of water related issues, and representing the Ministry in Water Sustainability Act appeals. You are vital to managing staff and communicating with staff, government agencies, the executive and the public, both in writing and orally. You also oversee a team of professional, technical and clerical staff and are responsible for team performance, human resource issues and training and development.

Qualifications for this role include:

• Degree in a natural resource or engineering field and 5 years of related experience.

• Registered, or immediately eligible for registration with the British Columbia professional association as required by the specialty area (i.e. Institute of Agrologists, Engineers & Geoscientists BC). Note: primary example of immediate eligibility of registration is being currently registered as a professional in another Canadian province and that registration can be immediately transferred to the BC professional association of your specialty area.

• Minimum of 2 years of experience managing technical and/or professional staff in resource management or infrastructure development.

• Experience in negotiating/mediating solutions.

• Valid BC driver's license or equivalent.

• Preference may be given to candidates with experience in hydrology.
