Academic EndocrinologistThe Department of Medicine, Faculty of Health Sciences at McMaster University and Hamilton Health Sciences invite applicants for an Academic Physician to join the Division of Endocrinology. This is a full-time faculty position for a period of three years (renewable). Academic rank will be commensurate with the candidate's qualifications and experience. Applicants will have completed specialty training in Endocrinology with a combination of clinical, research and educational activities having been undertaken. Completion of subspecialty training in endocrinological disorders of pregnancy including expertise in managing all categories of diabetes and pregnancy (preconception care, type 1 diabetes, type 2 diabetes and gestational diabetes) is required. Applicants must have completed a Masters level training in Quality Improvement & Patient Safety. The successful candidate will be a full-time member of the Division of Endocrinology and will be expected to contribute to the academic mission of the Faculty and Division. The successful candidate must have interest in undergraduate and post-graduate teaching. Applicants should be certified (or eligible for certification) by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and must be licensed (or eligible for licensure) in the Province of Ontario. Please apply online directing your application to: Lorrie Reurink Manager, Human Resources and Faculty Recruitment Interested applicants must include an up-to-date curriculum vitae, description of training and research experience as well as the names of three professional referees. All qualified applicants are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be considered first for this position. To comply with the Government of Canada's reporting requirements, the University is obliged to gather information about applicants' status as either Permanent Residents of Canada or Canadian citizens. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or current citizenship; however, all applications must include one of the following statements: "Yes, I am a citizen or permanent resident of Canada" or "No, I am not a citizen or permanent resident of Canada".
