Its primary role is to collect, organize, preserve, disseminate, and provide access to essential information resources. The Libraries collaborate across all parts of the University to foster critical thinkers and lifelong learners. The Libraries' collection consists of over one million items including: 523,000 ebooks and 467,000 print books; 104,000 ejournals, as well as access to databases, datasets and video collections for streaming. These holdings reflect the breadth of programs available at the University. Electronic resources can be accessed on-site through library computers or laptops that have wireless connectivity. Authorized users can also gain access from off-campus locations. The Libraries support an extensive information literacy program that is designed to build students' university-level research skills. This program includes on-site research support, chat reference, and specialized classroom instruction at the course level.
