The Opportunity

Are you a Steamfitter looking to build a rewarding and stable career with a reputable educational institution as TMU? Are you #MadeOfGrit? The Steamfitter undertakes regular inspections, preventative maintenance and corrective maintenance, modifications, repairs and adjustments to piping and components of water, gas, air and vacuum services including laboratories and mechanical plan rooms. They complete implementation of steam service requests from campus clients. Responsibilities may include, but are not limited to the following:

- Maintains and repairs all steam lines, compressed air piping, pressure reducing and regulating valves and all associated fittings.
- Lays out, assembles, installs and repairs pipes, fixtures and fittings used for steam distribution, waste disposal and gas distribution according to steam and gas codes.
- Installs and repairs steam valves and fittings made of metals such as iron, steel, lead or copper.
- Measures, cuts and threads pipe, using pipe cutters, hack saw, flaring tools and pipe threading tools or machines.
- Joins pipe sections using fittings, couplings, elbows, solder, lead, screws, bolts and clamps; secures pipes in position using brackets and hangers.
- Connects components together such as steam supply piping and control valves.
- Maintains and repairs installed steam systems by tracing and rectifying defects, replacing broken pipes and fixtures.
- Locates, lays out and marks position for connections, passage holes and fixtures in walls and floors to accommodate pipes and fixtures.
- Undertakes a comprehensive preventative maintenance program and ensures proper maintenance cycles and

schedules are maintained and data given to the supervisor.

- Under the direction of the Supervisor, undertakes preventative maintenance and replacement of components such as valves, strainers and traps of installed piping systems involving hot water heating, steam (to 200 psi), chilled water etc., forming part of the physical resources distribution system.
- Undertakes modification, replacement and major repair of piping and components such as valves, traps, strainers, etc., in the boiler plant, chiller plant, fan rooms, mechanical rooms etc. under the direction of the Supervisor
- Completes bills of material, estimates, sketches and other documentation as required.
- Modifies, replaces and repairs pneumatic piping and calibrating control valves for HVAC systems.
