Additionally, this role will support the promotion of democratic engagement materials and training. Key responsibilities include:

- Develop, produce and deliver asset based interactive and dynamic engagement programs to increase democratic engagement in communities across Canada which face barriers to political participation.

- Works with campus partners, student and community organizations and community members to maximize engagement in the The Exchange democratic engagement programs.
