The Senior Program Developer, Indigenous Economic Opportunity will contribute to the work of the Regional Programs and Engagement (RPE) Branch supporting and facilitating Indigenous peoples and First Nation communitiesâ€TM participation in the economy. This contribution will include RPEâ€TMs role in hosting the Indigenous Business and Investment Council (IBIC) secretariat, the Federal-Provincial-Territorial Working Group on Innovation and Economic Development's (IED) Indigenous Economic Development Sub-Committee, and other indigenous economic and business development initiatives. The positionâ€TMs primary duties shall include:

• Supports IBIC Secretariat's activities, including leading the coordination of Council operations and its good governance.

• Leading the implementation of the IBIC strategic plan's outreach activities including partnership engagements, industry trade show and Indigenous events outreach, and supervision of IBIC's online presence and assets. • Implementation of the Federal-Provincial-Territorial IED Working Group's Indigenous Economic Development subcommittee's agenda and work plans.

• Provides support for the Ministry's ongoing policy work and activities for Indigenous economic development. • Significant public engagement with Indigenous business and community leaders, and Indigenous peoples, and business and industry leaders across the province.

Qualifications for this role include:

• Bachelor's Degree or higher in economics, First Nation studies, Indigenous governance, business administration, political science, public administration or a liberal arts field of study. An equivalent combination of education and experience may be considered.

• Minimum 2 years of experience in research, policy development, performance review and/or financial/economic analysis.

• Minimum 2 years of experience negotiating agreements and working collaboratively in partnership arrangements. • Minimum 1 year of experience managing projects and/or project components.

• Significant cultural and social experience in a land-based indigenous community context.

• Experience with protocols and practices for successful engagement with Indigenous peoples and communities.

• Preference may be given to qualified applicants who self-identify as having Indigenous Ancestry (status, non-status, Metis or Inuit).

• Further preference may be given to those with more years of experience in any of the areas above
