Reporting to the Regional or Provincial Coordinator, the Community Program Leader (CPL) is responsible for the direct coordination, implementation and delivery of Spirit North's sport and land-based activity programs to Indigenous children and youth in the communities within a designated region.

Specific responsibilities include:

- Ensuring that all program delivery, communication and engagement is done in a manner that demonstrates cultural and historical awareness and sensitivity, and an enjoyable, inclusive and supported experience for Indigenous children and youth
- Working within a budget to develop and facilitate engagement and collaborative opportunities between community leaders, school administrators, transportation, and recreational area operators
- Working with key community and school leaders to build community capacity for program delivery
- Refining and adjusting program designs in response to community and participant needs
- Ensuring Spirit North program methodology is integrated into programs
- Meeting Spirit North reporting requirements
- Working with the Spirit North team and community members to coordinate and lead any special events
