Position Description The Department of Psychology, Neuroscience & Department of Psychol in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada invites applications for a full-time, teaching stream faculty position at the Assistant Professor level, beginning July 1, 2022. We seek an individual with a PhD in Psychology or a related discipline to teach a variety of courses in the broad discipline of Psychology. We are particularly interested in experienced candidates with an enthusiasm for teaching high enrolment courses to a cross-disciplinary audience of students with a broad range of backgrounds. Teaching experience in courses in the areas of Applied Psychology, Social Psychology, or Developmental Psychology would be particularly suitable for this position, but we encourage flexible instructors with expertise in any area of Psychology to apply. The Department of Psychology, Neuroscience & Dehaviour has a long-standing commitment to research in experimental psychology (perception, cognition, development, cognitive and behavioural neuroscience, animal behaviour, sensory neuroscience, evolutionary psychology). This research focus is complemented by an equally long-standing history of excellence in undergraduate instruction across the broader discipline of Psychology, including topics aligned with clinical, social, and applied psychology. A complete application consists of: a cover letter (including a statement regarding whether the applicant has Canadian citizenship/permanent resident status (see below)) a current Curriculum Vitae a statement of teaching philosophy and interests (2-page maximum) a summary of prior teaching experience (with class sizes), and any prior/planned activity in the area of scholarship of teaching and learning (2-page maximum) a summary of all available teaching evaluations a statement of experience and plans for advancing equity, diversity and inclusion in post-secondary education, community-based or other professional settings (2-page maximum) the names and full contact information of at least three referees. Letters of reference are not required and will not be reviewed at the application stage; the Department will request letters of recommendation from referees at later stages of the search process.

Review of complete applications will begin January 15, 2022 and continue until the position is filled. All applicants will receive an on-line, system-generated confirmation of receipt of their application; however, only short-listed applicants will be contacted for interviews. Please be advised that any full-time, permanent faculty member of the Department can request confidential access to the application materials, including the reference letters. Progressive policies are in place to assist faculty members achieve a work-life balance. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be given priority. To comply with the Government of Canada' reporting requirements, the University is obliged to gather information about applicants' status as either Canadian citizens or Permanent Residents of Canada. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or current citizenship; however, all applications, as stated above, MUST include one of the following statements in their application package: "l am/am not a citizen or permanent resident of Canada." Applications that do not include this information will be deemed incomplete.
