Focus Forward for Indigenous Youth is a young and ambitious registered (national) charity. We are working to address education and employment gaps facing Indigenous youth by providing experiential learning opportunities to cultivate career and life skills through working on community projects. Project specifics are strategically selected by community partners, ensuring that each project responds to local community needs and involves Indigenous youth pre and post project in a culturally appropriate way to create new spaces that are economically beneficial, sustainable and culturally relevant.

Having successfully completed two pilot programs, our team is now launching our programming on a national scale. Job Summary

The National Program Support Manager is the lead for the development and delivery of programming to combat educational and employment barriers faced by Indigenous youth. By researching and identifying these barriers and determining appropriate training opportunities, this role will help ensure youth have the skills and supports to excel during and following project participation.

This role is reporting to another new role, the National Program Manager. Both are in accordance with a new Federal Government grant and are under the administrative direction of the Focus Forward Board.

The Focus Forward Board is inclusive of diverse voices, insights, backgrounds and experiences to bring together a variety of expertise. We strive to be representative of Canadian society and uphold the value of belonging. We are a group of young professionals working to create positive impact in Indigenous communities.

The role is remote and will require travel among the Canadian communities Focus Forward serves.

Experience

• Experience working in a not-for-profit environment as an industry professional or a relevant field

• Experience working in youth engagement and/or educational programming

• Experience and comfortability working with diverse Indigenous communities

• Experience with trades based projects and programing

Essential Skills

In this role, you will:

• Conduct stakeholder engagement and in-depth research to create educational curriculum and training plans (programming) that will help youth address educational and employment barriers. This programming will be developed based on the desires and needs of the local community and in conjunction with education and future skilled trades best practices.

• Develop youth support guides to address specific needs during and post programing, including but not exclusive to tutors, mentors and resources for career/education guidance

• Develop a database of post-secondary/training/apprenticeship programs and post program supports

• Develop and deliver programing in collaboration with accredited partners including hands on programing, classroom employment and skills training workshops to deliver curriculum and evaluation plans

• Lead the growth and delivery of youth programs and signature events and resources across communities

• Lead program reporting, including financial reports and impact assessments

• Work with suppliers to purchase equipment and materials required for effective and safe work in-classroom and hands-on programming

• Lead recruitment of youth participation through marketing and educational staff partners

• Let your hair down and recognize the achievements of youth and communities by organizing celebrations or graduations

• Assist the National Program Manager to design, develop, action and evaluate programs and meet reporting requirements

• Assist the National Program Manager to hire part-time training staff (regional coordinators) to help with the delivery of youth training and programming

• Assist the National Program Manager Engage corporate sponsors, researching granting opportunities and writing and submitting grant applications to secure necessary resources to fund capital expenses
