As an Indigenous Patient Navigator with Vancouver Coastal Health you will:

Be accountable for providing day-to-day health sector navigation support to Aboriginal clients, and their families, of Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH). Liaises on behalf of clients with medical professionals and other health care providers to ensure their successful access to primary care and community-based health care services.

Be responsible for the facilitation of patient care, and the informing of program development, planning and evaluation of services for Aboriginal clients.

Hold key partnerships with the Indigenous Health Team, VCH medical and health care providers and leadership. Liaise with a variety of Indigenous community based agencies.
