JOB REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility requirements for the Indigenous Youth Internship Program:

- Due to nature of the program and in accordance with Section 42 of the BC Human Rights Code, only people of Indigenous heritage (First Nations, Metis, or Inuit) will be considered

- 19 to 29 years of age as of September 1, 2024
- Currently reside in British Columbia

- Grade 12 graduation as of March 2024, or equivalent with some post-secondary education, or equivalent with a combination of work, life, community, education and/or experience as noted below

- Demonstrated leadership potential, either through work, community or volunteer experience, for example:

- Youth representative on a youth council
- Community governance
- Organizing your community's participation in large events and gatherings
- Co-ordinating cultural events
- Board member for an organization
- Coaching in sport
