The successful candidate will be a leader with vision and compassion, who can bring out the best in a team and can collaborate well with other programming teams across CBC. We're looking for someone obsessed with excellence, creating great, relevant content and a great place to work. This role is integral to enriching how people connect to CBC at the local level. This means deepening our original and enterprise storytelling and ensuring we talk about what matters most to people in the Cree communities of the Eeyou Istchee James Bay.

You will deliver on this through a focus on three priorities.

Content: In this role, you will ensure that CBC journalistic standards are met and that our stories are fair, balanced, accurate, thoughtful, and resonate with the Cree communities. You're innovative and will inspire the team to try new things, new workflows and new story treatments across all platforms: radio, television and digital.
