Description

What Are We About

Fleming is located in the heart of the Kawartha Lakes Region in Central Ontario—a beautiful place to live and work, surrounded by natural beauty and a mere 90 minutes north-east of Toronto. Who Are We

The rapidly expanding School of Trades & Technology makes part of its home in the Kawartha Trades and Technology Centre, an 87,000-square-foot trades and technology skills training facility which features state-of-the-art, sustainable shop facilities, smart-wired classrooms and labs with the newest technology. A large open area, called the Skills Arena, allows students from a number of different trades programs such as carpentry, electrical, HRAC, plumbing and welding to learn and train in one location, as they would on a construction site. Aspiring chefs learn their trade in our culinary program where they put their skills to practice in our sixty-five-seat on-site restaurant. The School also delivers exceptional technology programming in a number of disciplines including computer engineering, wireless information networking, instrumentation and control engineering, computer security and investigations, electrical engineering and more.

What This Position is About:

Reporting to the Operations Manager, School of Trades & Technology, this position supports academic program delivery for the Carpentry and Construction programs and events (including Dual Credit, Skills Ontario, Trades Days camps). You will work safely and ensure that all Carpentry and Construction laboratories have adequate materials and working equipment which includes inspecting, troubleshooting, repairing, replacing and calibrating a variety of Carpentry and

Construction-related equipment as well as establishing and following preventive maintenance schedules. You participate in the preparation and delivery of laboratory exercises which includes: assisting faculty with equipment research requests; designing and building new equipment and devices; fabricating parts and other items; performing test runs of lab exercises for faculty; setting up lab equipment, demonstrations and teaching aids; demonstrating laboratory equipment and techniques to students; assisting students in the labs by reinforcing concepts taught by faculty; and diagnosing and repairing equipment on demand during lab sessions. You create and update equipment work instructions and safety manuals and ensure that these procedures and safety standards are followed in the labs, which also includes the proper storage and handling of hazardous and waste materials. In addition to being responsible for maintaining a collection of service manuals and repair history records, you will order equipment and supplies for the Carpentry and Construction programs and look after inventory control. In this role you will also be responsible for: obtaining quotes; initiating purchase requisitions; administering Safety Data Sheets for the Carpentry and Construction programs; and sourcing parts for students.

What We Are Looking For:

- Minimum two-year diploma and/or Certificate of Qualification (CoQ) in a carpentry, construction or related discipline and a minimum of 5 years^{â€™} relevant work experience (post-diploma/CoQ) or relevant combination of education and work experience.

- Experience with inventory control and purchasing.

- Experience inspecting, troubleshooting, repairing and calibrating a variety of equipment related to the construction and/or carpentry trades

- Experience reading blueprints and schematics with strong analytical and calculation abilities.

- Demonstrates core values of accountability, responsiveness, inclusiveness, innovation and collaboration

- Embraces diversity and easily adapts in a challenging environment where a diversity of people, situations and issues are encountered

- Excellent organization, prioritization, problem solving, research and time management skills, with a keen focus on health and safety as well as the ability to meet changing deadlines.

- Knowledge of best practices and Ministry of Labour standards for maintenance of equipment such as fume extraction and gas detection.

- Demonstrated leadership and team skills and the ability to work independently.

- Strong interpersonal and communication skills, including the ability to deliver effective demonstrations

- Proficiency with a variety of computer programs including spreadsheet, word processing, internet applications, email, and inventory software.

- Experience in an educational or training environment is preferred as is training in Standard First Aid and 5S elements.
