This position can be based in any of the following Public Safety & Solicitor General offices: Surrey, Vancouver, Abbotsford, and Port Coquitlam.

The Victim Court Support Program provides direct services to victims of serious crime through the criminal court process including emotional support, safety planning, accompaniment to court proceedings, liaising with Crown Counsel on behalf of victims, and proactively arranging referrals to other support services.

With a comprehensive understanding of the impacts of violence and trauma on victims of crime, Victim Court Support Caseworkers provide emotional support, safety planning, referrals, information and accompaniment to victims and witnesses of serious offences and their families as they proceed through the court process. Caseworkers work independently at different courthouses without direct on-site supervision. The Caseworker should have an understanding of the Criminal Justice System and the relevant Legislation and Policy, Caseworkers interpret and convey complex case specific information to a diverse group of victims in terms they can understand.
