Crew leads and other BC Parks staff will lead crew members to perform project work. Crew members will get hands-on work experience, education and training. They will also develop personal and professional skills as well as career and community networks.

- This position requires you to have a valid FULL BC driver's license (minimum class 5), or an equivalent class driver's license from another province or jurisdiction.

- Must attend Program Training May 14 to May 19, 2023 at Manning Provincial Park near Hope, BC. Details on this training will be provided at the offer of employment.
