The Senior EP Officer protects the environment by providing authoritative and professional advice to others on the Environmental Management Act and the management of industrial, municipal, agricultural, point and non-point source wastes and hazardous materials. Manages authorizations of high-risk, complex and unique sites/situations in the region, conducting source monitoring to study impacts of toxins and wastes to lead compliance, continuous improvement and effective management of waste discharges into the environment. Leads regional and area-based environmental protection planning, developing systematic approaches, policies and regulations. The position provides authoritative technical and policy advice to ministry staff, elected officials, industry and municipal executives, other agencies and the public on controversial or complex waste management issues.

• Registered in good standing, or eligible for immediate\* registration, as a fully licensed professional engineer with the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of the Province of British Columbia (EGBC).

\*Immediately eligible means you are a fully licensed registered professional engineer in good standing in another Canadian jurisdiction and can be immediately transferred to EGBC.
