What you'll do

- Support the development and the execution of community engagement plans and strategies to support operational priorities regionally, pipeline integrity and capital project capacity (where applicable)
- Identify, build and maintain relationships with communities and key stakeholders including public officials and emergency responders
- Work with internal clients and the Quebec Lead to execute strategies in support of Damage Prevention within Public Awareness, Regional Emergency Preparedness, Community Investment and TC Energy's Scholarship Program
- Prepare and deliver presentations to external audiences on our corporate, project, and operations activities
- Participate in the development of project communication materials and coordinate the delivery of project information packages and updates
