Reporting to the Director, the Traditional Healing Coordinator is responsible for coordinating access to Traditional Healers, Elders and Knowledge Keepers, providing traditional healing through the coordination of ceremonies, access to traditional medicine and cultural programming, and creating cultural knowledge exchange and translation in a safe and welcoming environment. The Traditional Healing Coordinator will serve across St. Joseph's Care Group (SJCG), role modeling Indigenous values and promoting quality client-centered care through spiritual and cultural services for Indigenous clients.

- An individual who is of Indigenous ancestry with an in-depth understanding of Indigenous culture and tradition, worldview, history, ceremonies, and language
- Minimum 5 years' experience working with Indigenous people in the health or social service field
