As an Electromechanical Specialist, you will primarily provide preventive and corrective maintenance of the electromechanical aspects of all types of postal equipment to ensure its good working order and continued operation. This includes all phases of maintenance, i.e. troubleshooting, testing, repair and monitoring of mail-processing and mail-handling equipment. In this role, you will also be responsible for maintaining the associated electrical and electronic portions of systems.

â€¢ Knowledge of testing, diagnosis and adjusting of mechanical or electro-mechanical systems and equipment.

â€¢ Understanding of mechanical, hydraulic, and pneumatic systems and principles.

â€¢ Basic understanding of electronics and electrical systems and principles.

â€¢ Ability to exercise physical effort in lifting heavy equipment and tools, and perform maintenance routines under a variety of conditions, including cramped spaces, heights and other awkward positions.

- o Recommend changes in prevention maintenance procedures and practices.
- o Conduct investigations to determine cause of breakdowns and recommend remedial action to prevent recurrences.
