Hatch is seeking a Field Inspection Services Co-op Student with an interest in Power Transmission Systems (transmission lines and substations) for a 4- to 8- month internship. You will work as part of the Owner's Engineer team on the Wataynikaneyap Power Transmission Project, which is an unprecedented First Nations led project to build 230 kV, 115 kV, 44 kV and 25 kV transmission lines and substations in northwestern Ontario.
