Note: This position is funded by the Government of Canada - Canada Summer Jobs program. There are three eligibility requirements for applicants:

- (a) is between 15 and 30 years of age (inclusive) at the start of employment;
- (b) is a Canadian Citizen, permanent resident, or person on whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*; and
- (c) is legally entitled to work according to the relevant provincial / territorial legislation and regulations.

*International students are not eligible. Recent immigrants are eligible if they are Canadian Citizens or permanent residents.

SUMMARY

The Community and Volunteer Engagement Assistant will support the Development team to raise the profile of Canuck Place in Fraser Valley Communities. They will engage in the community to ensure that Canuck Place is accessible and attractive to diverse populations with a focus on the South Asian community. A high degree of professionalism, compassion and ability to act as a positive ambassador for the organization is crucial. This role will also provide administrative support to the Volunteer Services and Development teams, and will likely include direct exposure to children and families.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Support the community engagement strategies, projects, and processes on the Corporate and Community Development team, with a goal of maximizing fundraising revenue
- The first half of the role will support the project planning and execution of Development fundraising strategies aligning with the time period of the placement, which may include (but is not limited to): CPCH Extraordinary People campaign, E-Gaming for CPCH; outreach to Canada Helps donors, and Fitness for CP outreach campaign.
- The second half of the role will support summer Sporting events held in support of CPCH, including donor stewardship, promotion, recognition, and partner planning support
- Reviews current materials and makes recommendations to ensure they are appropriate and accessible to diverse communities, including South Asian communities in the Fraser Valley.
- Provides support for Canuck Place events as appropriate, largely in a virtual capacity. Some in-person support may be required, which will adhere to or exceed all provincial requirements and recommendations for Covid-19 safety

- Assumes other related responsibilities, such as donor thank you calls, file management, pitch document preparation, and stewardship mailouts, as assigned.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE
