Responsibilities will include teaching and supervising at the undergraduate and graduate levels; contributing to the undergraduate and graduate programs, including curriculum development and expansion as appropriate; establishing and maintaining a strong research agenda; and participating in the academic life of the Department of English, the Faculty, and the University.
