As the Ecosystems Biologist, you will develop and implement ecosystem conservation, Species at Risk, restoration and enhancement projects with other agencies on the archipelago. The position serves a role in gathering and providing a broad range of aquatic and terrestrial expertise to Statutory Decision Makers of various resource sectors and will provide a key professional role to the assessment of management practices on ecosystems and species of concern in the region. Acting as a designated Habitat Officer, you will also lead the Haida Gwaii Natural Resource District with the review and preparation of authorizations that fall under the Water Sustainability Act.

Dajing Giids or the Village of Queen Charlotte is one of seven communities on Haida Gwaii. 90 km off the northwest coast of British Columbia and just south of the Alaska panhandle, Haida Gwaii is the unceded territory of the Haida Nation (<http://www.haidanation.ca/>) and home to a diverse group of rural island dwellers. A total population of approximately 4,500 is spread throughout the archipelago and provides for eclectic small community living with a big city cultural vibe and all the amenities youâ€™TM ever need.
