The role ensures that students are provided with the highest standard of mental health care and service, in a timely, caring and inclusive manner assisting the university in meeting its responsibilities of providing holistic and safe opportunities for students to learn and thrive.

Qualifications

Education:

- Registered Nurse from a recognized School of Nursing
- A member in good standing with the College of Nurses of Ontario

Experience:

- 3 years' experience providing patient care across the age continuum and dealing with the spectrum of health care issues
- 1 year of recent, related experience working in an acute mental health care program
- Experience with the principles of health promotion, including immunizations, vaccinations, communicable diseases, sexual health and harm reduction measures
- Experience in public health, emergency, urgent care and crisis intervention
