This position will work collaboratively with operational and functional services leadership across CAE Canada to deliver on Indigenous relations goals including, Indigenous staff recruitment and retention, engagement with Indigenous communities and organizations, identifying business opportunities, and strengthening internal awareness of Indigenous cultures, histories, and issues.
