This position will provide instruction to Justice Studies program students. Education Requirements

1. University degree in Sociology, Criminology, Justice Studies, or related education in the field of criminal justice.

2. Minimum of five years recent and relevant experience as a correctional officer in a federal and/or provincial correctional adult institution or a member of a municipal or RCMP police service.

3. Two years' experience in development and delivery of adult education and training in the field of law enforcement. Working knowledge of and ability to apply basic principles and practices of adult education within various delivery systems and to develop curriculum materials utilizing appropriate training design and instructional techniques.

4. Demonstrated knowledge of the philosophy of corrections and/or policing from both an historical and current perspective.

5. Working knowledge of current trends and research in the field of law enforcement.

6. Demonstrated problem solving and strong decision making and strategic planning skills.

7. Excellent interpersonal and communications skills (oral and written) and the ability to work with people from equity groups.

8. Able to obtain a clear criminal record check and full satisfactory security clearances.

9. Computer skills including competence with Microsoft Office.

10. Experience working in Aboriginal communities.

11. Ability to function as a team member in an ever-changing environment.
