"Reporting to the Director of Indigenous Student Support and Community Relations, and as a member of the School of Indigenous Education's wellness team located at the Notre Dame Campus and Exchange District Campuses, the Wellness Counsellor is responsible for providing personal counselling on a range of issues to Indigenous students of Red River College. The Wellness Counsellor is responsible for providing culturally appropriate educational, financial and personal counselling to current and prospective Indigenous students through one-on-one advising, workshops, and resource development regarding Indigenous student social, emotional and spiritual issues with a focus on safety, respect, and accessibility while honoring students in their education journey. The incumbent will attend meetings and case consultation; work collaboratively and in cooperation with Counsellors, Indigenous Student Support personnel, College faculty, external agencies and educational institutions; and develop and deliver relevant workshops and short courses."

- Several years of experience in a counselling environment with Indigenous peoples, including case management responsibilities of assessment, planning, implementation, monitoring and closure

- Experience developing and delivering relevant workshops
