What will you be responsible for

Mechanical Maintainers have the highest regard for safety, are responsible for maintaining systems needed to fuel and control nuclear reactors plus ancillary systems. Job responsibilities include, but are not limited to the following:

- Maintain and repair items such as compressors, valves, motors, pumps, turbines, hydraulic systems and generators

- May be required to work from heights, in confined spaces, and in environments containing, respiratory radiological, chemical, electrical, and mechanical hazards

- Provide feedback to technical staff regarding the condition of the equipment through dismantling, inspection and re-assembly in accordance with established procedures

- Carry out quality predictive maintenance, preventive, corrective and breakdown maintenance, to ensure reliable system operation and ensure the equipment is in a good state of repair

- This work may be performed on a twelve hour, rotating shift schedule
