Vancouver Coastal Health is looking for a Mental Health Clinician with a Master's Degree in Behavioural Science to join the Vancouver Community Child & Youth Mental Health team in supporting street involved, marginalized youth in Vancouver, BC.

As a Mental Health Clinician with Vancouver Child & Youth Mental Health, you will:

Perform assessments, coordinate client care, and provide treatment services that are culturally appropriate for Aboriginal youth with severe mental health issues and their families.

Conduct psychosocial assessments on Aboriginal children experiencing severe behavioural, social, emotional disturbances and serious mental health problems.

Collaborate with multidisciplinary team and consult with team psychologist and psychiatrists/pediatrician to develop, implement, maintain, and adjust individualized treatment plans. Provide treatment services that are sensitive to Aboriginal culture including behavioural interventions, family sessions, parent groups, psychoeducation, and individual child counselling using a combination of western and traditional aboriginal care practices and approaches, as appropriate.

Establish and maintain relationships based on respect and understanding.

Initiate and participate in case conferences/meetings.

Provide support to colleagues and consultative services to children & youth services providers for continuity of care.
