Providing program guidance around story coverage including length, deadlines, updates, treatments and value-added material, ensuring close collaboration between program units and news.

Planning, organizing, coordinating and monitoring all Yukon program content to ensure breadth of coverage, variety of innovative treatments and quality of work throughout the day

Resource allocation, as well as budget and business outcomes.

Establishing a vision and measurable outcomes for programming and ensuring the team adheres to targets.

Providing strong direction throughout the day to the program team on - expectation around story coverage and development.

Planning, leading and assigning special event coverage.

Liaising with other programs and departments, including news and regions.

Developing staff by providing mentorship and opportunities to personnel assigned to the program, as well as freelance contributors, giving ongoing feedback and using the performance management process, and overseeing internships and scholarships.

Being the lead on journalistic policy, legal expertise and editorial judgment for the program team.

Performing all or part of the function or duties of producers as required.
