BCTS operates in 33 communities and directly supports over 8,000 jobs across B.C. The goal of BCTS is to provide credible representative price and cost benchmark data for the market pricing system through auctions of timber harvested from public land in BC.

The Indigenous Peoples Engagement Specialist works within the BCTS business area to develop and maintain positive relationships with Indigenous Peoples to advance BCTS's business principle dedicated to true and lasting reconciliation. The position works directly with Indigenous Peoples and BCTS staff to plan and facilitate legal consultation processes (i.e. preparation, engagement, accommodation, decision and follow-up) consistent with legal requirements, reconciliation and relationship building, and supports senior staff in negotiation and implementation of business-to-business and relational agreements that contribute to effective and durable relationships with Indigenous Peoples.

Qualifications for this role include:

• Registered, or eligible for registration, with the British Columbia professional association as required by the specialty area, (i.e., Association of BC Forest Professionals, Institute of Agrologists, Association of Professional Engineers & Geoscientists) and 2 years of experience, gained within the last 5 years, related to natural resource or Indigenous Peoples relationship management.

• Must possess at minimum a valid Class 5 B.C. Driver's License that does not limit or restrict the ability to conduct the duties of the job.

Preference may be given to applicants with the following:

• Experience with contract management.

• Education related to Indigenous Peoples.

• Experience conducting research and analysis related to land use, resource management, social or economic development issues.
