The Senior Policy Advisor, Indigenous Economic Development will contribute to the Ministry of Jobs, Economic Recovery and Innovation (JERI) and the BC Government's work on reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples, including Indigenous participation and partnership in building out a shared vision for the economy. This role's responsibilities include leading files that support the implementation of the StrongerBC Economic Plan, collaborating with the Ministry of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation on the MIRR/JERI Joint Office on Indigenous Economic Development, as well as supporting cross-government Indigenous economic development initiatives. This role involves substantial policy analysis and program management, nurturing relationships with Indigenous organizations and First Nations, and planning and delivering engagements.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Degree or diploma in Indigenous studies, Indigenous governance, business administration, political science, public administration, economics or a related discipline, AND Three (3) or more years of experience in a public or Indigenous organization conducting policy analysis, developing public policy, managing programs and/or projects, OR
- A degree or diploma in an unrelated discipline, AND Five (5) or more years of experience in a public or Indigenous organization conducting policy analysis, developing public policy, managing programs and/or projects.
- Minimum one (1) year of experience working collaboratively with Indigenous Peoples or Indigenous organizations.
- Experience displaying cultural agility, sensitivity and awareness of organizational and personal biases.
- Preference may be given to qualified applicants who self-identify as having Indigenous ancestry (status, non-status, Metis or Inuit).
