An integral member of a multi-disciplinary Community Mental Health Team and in coordination with other community agencies and professionals, you provide a range of mental health services to children, youth and their families, when the child or youth is suffering from serious emotional, psychological, behavioural or psychiatric illness.

As a Clinician, Child and Youth Mental Health, you provide direct clinical services such as Intake, Assessment, Treatment, Suicide Risk Assessment, Safety Plans and Crisis Intervention to Indigenous and non-Indigenous children and youth from birth to age 18 and their families. Consulting with community agencies, schools, hospitals, and other ministry programs, you understand the importance of being involved in community education, development, coordination and prevention/early intervention programs. You build and maintain relationships with a wide variety of stakeholders in the community to ensure that conflicts are resolved and appropriate outcomes are achieved.

Qualifications for this role include:

• Master's in Social Work, Educational Counselling, Clinical Psychology, Child and Youth Care or comparable Graduate Degree at the Master's level or equivalent.

NOTE: If your degree was obtained outside of Canada, you need to confirm it has been assessed for equivalency through the International Credential Evaluation Services (ICES). Confirmation for equivalency for your degree is required for you to be considered.
