You will apply extensive experience in community work along with your knowledge of Indigenous studies, social sciences and community development and be “hands on” in the daily implementation of our work. You will have extensive experience in project and control management, budget development and community relations and will have managed complex projects. You will provide advice and support to the team in the development and success of the Indigenous engagement program.

The successful candidate must be willing to learn, to take initiative, to be able to communicate clearly, plan and organize well, to trouble-shoot and problem solve. Other personal skills include the ability to work effectively in a team environment and independently, and a “can do” attitude with a track record of leadership and success in varied endeavors.

Experience

• Over 6 years and up to and including 8 years is considered necessary to gain this experience.

• Knowledge of community development, public engagement and public policy and understanding of Indigenous organizational structure and culture in Canada and Indigenous consultation.

• Public engagement and indigenous relations experience on projects involving multiple interests.

• Demonstrated background in working with the general public and Indigenous people in a variety of settings with increasing level of complexity in relationships.

• Preference will be given to applicants with an understanding of Indigenous communities and culture in Ontario.
• Preference will be given to applicants who reside in Northwestern Ontario or are willing to relocate.
