Description

Qualifications:

Knowledge of Canadian law schools and the Canadian legal profession is required. Demonstrated leadership in program design and evaluation, policy development, strategic planning, and coaching/counselling is essential. The successful candidate will be tactful and diplomatic, with an ability to maintain composure and retain a positive and professional attitude under pressure and in difficult situations. Understanding of issues, challenges and opportunities relating to the equity, diversity, and inclusion of law school students from underrepresented groups is vital to this role. Superior written and verbal communication, public speaking, and presentation skills are required.
