Qualifications for this role include:

• Registered, or eligible for registration, as professional (i.e. Registered Professional Forester) with the British Columbia association as required by the specialty area, and 2 years of experience related to natural resource or Indigenous Peoples relationship management. • Class 5 B.C. Driver's License that does not limit or restrict the ability to conduct the duties of the job.

• Experience or education related to Indigenous Peoples relationship management.

• Experience conducting research and analysis related to land use, resource management, social or economic development issues.
